Lin Lab Members Win Best Student Paper Award at MEMS 2017

Their winning paper demonstrates "a fully-3D printed multi-input microfluidic concentration gradient generator, applied as an enhanced antibiotic screening tool to easily and rapidly determine individual antibiotic minimum inhibitory concentration values as well as to study the interactions of three antibiotics simultaneously in a gradient of 'drug cocktails' on ampicillin-resistant K-12 E.Coli Bacteria."
